## **SERVING WITHIN OUR WORSHIP**

The ministry of Holy Spirit Lutheran Church would not be possible without the contributions, both big and small, from all the volunteers who freely give their time and energy in service. The Worship Committee reached out to HSLC's ushers and the Altar Guild to ask why they chose to serve in these roles and what they enjoy about this act of service.

# Ushers: Why did you join?

- It is a straightforward act of service and support that doesn't require an extra time commitment, since I'm at worship anyway.
- I decided to usher to help out as a volunteer to our church community...it wouldn't run without volunteers.
- I do the ushering because it is one thing I can do to contribute. I have served on council and a variety of committees and don't really want to do that anymore but ushering and counting are things I can do.
- Volunteers were needed at the time.
- I am part of a church family and am willing to show my support by volunteering in some way. I am comfortable with ushering and feel I am helping Parishioners as they enter Worship. I also know that my assistance helps the Service run smoothly.
- I see ushering as helping to direct the flow of the congregation, especially during communion to ensure the process goes smoothly and orderly for all. It bothers me when the pastor and assistants have to wait for people at the altar rail to serve them. The ushers need to be inviting people forward so that communion can be served efficiently!
- It is an important ministry of hospitality. If no one is there to welcome and give a bulletin or instructions about the service, it feels as though something is lacking, especially for visitors.

# What do you enjoy about Ushering?

- I enjoy being part of the ritual of church. It's soothing and reassuring to reflect on many generations of Christians following a sacred pattern of worship.
- I like the camaraderie of having a co-usher, usually someone different each time. It's a little "get to know you while serving together" that adds to the process.
- Meeting and greeting people when I usher.
- Doing something I can do in the church and also just being part of the ushers' group.
- Greeting the congregation in the morning makes me smile, and sometimes they smile back.
- Greeting people and visiting people as they enter the Sanctuary. I also get a sense of accomplishment when I have assisted others.
- The opportunity to greet people and hopefully assist them in the worship experience.
- Greeting people and I try to be out in the open area as people come in just to welcome and answer any questions they may have.
- Learning more about our services and the interactions with people attending our services.

# NOV. 3 & 17 CHRISMON WORKSHOP



A 'Chrismon' is a Christmas ornament featuring Christian symbols, traditionally white and gold, derived from the words "Christ" and "Monogram." They are used to celebrate the meaning of Christmas and represent aspects of the faith, such as crosses, stars, and the Chi Rho symbol. They can be displayed on a special evergreen "Chrismon tree."

On **November 3<sup>rd</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup>, from 6:30 to 9:00 pm,** everyone is invited to come decorate Chrismons at HSLC! Sign up in the Narthex. Bring golden adornments to wrap or glue on bulbs: ribbons, sequins, stickers, beads...get creative!

## **ACCESSIBLE TO ALL**

The accessibility working group (Sandra T., Tom D., Chris S., & Sara D.) is working on a number of fronts to try and make Holy Spirit more accessible to all.
